There two new members of the COF board of directors. I want to thank Kevin Sansom and Steve Lichtenberger for stepping up to provide leadership for COF.



THE RIVER DEMOCRACY ACT AND FISHING THE Klamath River

This month we will have two presentations. We'll start with Sami Goodlove with an overview of the proposed River Democracy Act. Many of Oregon's most treasured trout streams are designated Wild & Scenic Rivers. Despite this federal protection, there are many others throughout the state that lack it. These streams provide critical salmon and steelhead habitat, supply drinking water to local communities, and provide bountiful outdoor recreation opportunities. They are also at risk due to drought, development, climate change, and pollution.

Sami will discuss how Wild & Scenic designation protects rivers and the fish populations that depend on them, as well as a current opportunity to designate and protect thousands of miles of new Wild & Scenic Rivers in Oregon. There's a good chance your favorite trout stream will benefit from this bill.

Sami Godlove was born and raised in central Oregon. He grew up in Bend, but the Metolius River could be called his family's second home. Sami moved back to Bend in early 2023 and is rediscovering his childhood love for fly fishing. He is the Central Oregon Field Associate for the environmental nonprofit Oregon Wild, working to protect the region's rivers and wildlands and is COF member.

I will follow Sami with a talk on fishing the Klamath River with a focus on steelhead. As you all know, three dams are being removed from the Klamath this year and many of you saw ODFW's Mark Hereford provide an overview of that effort last October. Dam removal should make an already good fishing destination even better. It's no further than heading to the Oregon coast and more than worth the trip.

EURO NYMPH Gear & Tactics

Happy February everyone! This month we'll be looking at Euro Nymph Gear & Tactics. There are a ton of videos out these days that show different Euro nymph techniques, and I've included several of them below. Starting with the basics and going up to more advanced levels, I hope you get the feel for what this technique attempts to do and how you can make yourself a more successful angler. I don't have the room in this column to put in links to all facets of Euro Nymphing, but these will give you a start on your journey. Just do a YouTube search for whatever subject you need and you'll find a plethora of info out there!

YouTube is a great resource to find multiple ways to learn different nymph techniques. Visit youtube.com to get started!

This video from the New Fly Fisher shows a typical Euro Nymph scenario - notice where he's fishing and how he casts, gets the proper drift, and finishes the drift. All important parts of using this method! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0jbkwSOkP5Y

This video from Devin Olsen (US Fly Fishing Team Member) shows how to adjust your depth while fishing, a very important aspect of Euro nymphing.

Here's another one from Devin showing how to add a dropper tag. There are lots of ways to do this: tippet ring, micro swivel, and using one of several knots; but this one shows what I think is the best knot for the job. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=U5o8rKAlf00

COF's fiscal year is the calendar year. The numbers in the chart are for calendar year 2023.

*A net loss had been budgeted for 2023 based on a conservative estimate of how much income would be produced by bringing back the annual Banquet & Fundraiser after a three-year absence. The Banquet produced \$5,500 more income than was projected, and we negotiated a larger contribution from the Sportsmen's Show for our staffing the kids' trout pond from \$1,500 to \$3,000. We also underspent our budgeted expenses by \$3,800, which included consolidating two storage lockers into one which saved \$1,267 on rental fees and less than projected KK fees.

Board Bits

JANUARY 25, 2024

President Fred Cholick called the meeting to order at 6:00PM with 11 of 13 members present.

Approval of the minutes: It was noted that because of the annual board retreat and the fact that Thanksgiving fell on the normal meeting date, there were no regular board minutes. However, since the board retreat was held in October the minutes from that meeting were reviewed and approved

Approval of the Treasurer's Report: The report was approved as presented. The treasurer, Tim Schindele, did note that 2023 had been a good year for the club's financial outlook as income had exceeded money spent. Look for a more detailed explanation in this newsletter.

New Business: New business included approving an updated club brochure and a new format for the monthly newsletter.

Also, of note was a clarification of our club's insurance regarding alcohol at club events. According to our insurer, if the club does not provide or serve alcohol, no additional insurance is required. BYOB will continue to be allowed at certain club events.

The board approved paying our membership fee to Fly-Fishers International.

A committee comprised of board members John Howard, Steve Lichenberger and an honorary life member will bring names of members nominated for club awards to the board meeting in February.

Old Business: On the issue of Monetary Grants to outside organizations, a lengthy discussion failed to reach consensus on the wording of the policy and the issue was tabled until the next meeting.

It was noted that a raffle at monthly meetings has been reestablished and the first one at the January meeting had a net profit of \$120.

Membership: Bob Shimane reported that 166 members have paid dues for 2024. More are expected to do so with the next reminder

Banquet Report: Tim reported that 23 had signed up for the event at this time. Raffle items continue to be solicited and many have been donated.

Programs: Yancy announced a full schedule of presenters for the year, minus June which he is working on filling. February will have Sami Goodlove speaking on the River Democracy Act and Yancy will do a presentation on fishing the Klamath River. Sportsman's Show: Kevin Sansom is chairman for this event and is seeking volunteers to help with the event. It will be held March 7-10. This event brings income of \$3000 to the club. He will be seeking volunteers to help.

Education: Tim Quinton will be doing a presentation on the various aspects of fly fishing an hour before each general meeting. They have been well received. He is exploring other possible classes.

Next Cast/Kokanee Karnival: President Fred Cholick reported that 3 events are scheduled in the near future: They are the Kokanee Karnival in April, the Partners for Conservation in February, and the Next Cast 3 day event for kids in June. Information about these events will be found in the newsletters. Volunteers will be solicited for these events.

FOR SALE: Fish Cat Cougar Pontoon boat, \$450.

This pontoon boat is in excellent condition and has been used very little. One of the main features of the Cougar boat is that it features a quad pontoon design which increases load capacity, stability, tracking and offers less wind resistance than other pontoon boats. This feature allows it to float in as little as 3" of water. The pontoons are 8 feet in length and it has 7'4" oars. It has a 10-piece aluminum frame which makes for compact storage and easy transport. It has saddle bags on each side of the seat for lots of storage. Jack

BILL'S BLM (BEADLESS MAYFLY) NYMPH

Last fall and early winter, my fishing partner and I regulary fished the Crooked River. Overall, we had good success with nearly 700 fish landed. We used a number of fly patterns but several were standouts. As the water got clearer (yes, it is as clear as the Deschutes River) the fish, especially those in the slower moving water, got more selective. One of the most effective fly patterns was Dave Hughes' Midge Fly. One day I was wading back to the bank to untangle my rig I noticed that my black fly hanging down had the perfect profile of a BWO nymph. The fly did not have a bead. So I designed a beadless (BL) mafly (M) nymph and took it to the river for a test. It uses few materials. I tie it in size 18 and 20 using dry fly hooks. It has no beads or added weight. As for colors, black, dark brown, and pheasant tail (seal bown abdomen, black thorax) are the best. I fish the fly about 3-4" from the stream bottom. It can be fished on a indicator rig or euro rig.

RECIPE

- 1. Size 18 and 20 dry fly hook
- 2.8/0 black or dark brown thread
- 3. Fluoro Fiber tail fibers (black, brown, grey)
- 4. Rib Sulky opal thread or extra small wire
- 5. Thorax and abdomen SLF dlubbing (black, dark brown, dark olive)

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Start thread and advance to bend in the hook
- 2. Attach 8-9 Fluoro Fibers, trim to shank length
- 3. Attached rib (Sulky opal thread or wire
- 4. Dub a slim abdomen with SLF dubbing
- 5. Rib with 4 turns of ribbing
- 6. Dub a thorax with SLF dubing so that you create a hackle-like wet fly hackle (see photo). Use velcro or brush to tease up the dubbing fibers. Whip finish.






