This was the largest fish that day, but had no adipose fin which means it was a hatchery fish planted in Prineville Reservoir which migrated into the river, most likely when the reservoir was low. Hatchery fish are not planted in the Crooked.

Update from ODFW on the Crooked River

his month we will hear from Tim Porter, ODFW's Deschutes District Assistant Fish Biologist. Tim will share the results of the annual Crooked River fish survey that occurred the 3rd week of June and with which club members assisted. This survey has been conducted for decades and Tim has been there for the last 12. I was one of the volunteers on the first day of the survey and was pleasantly surprised to see some reasonably sized trout after extremely low flows and high temperatures last fall, followed by some very cold weather, and then spring flows well above the level that has previously introduced gas bubble disease. The number of fish seemed much lower than in recent surveys, however, and I look forward to seeing the final results. Tim will also cover other issues of interest to club members such as high lakes tui chub removal and be available to answer your questions.

This is another excellent opportunity to volunteer to engage with youth. It is time for the Fall Stream Side program. The program is scheduled for September 25, 26, 28 & 29, 2023. The Stream Side program will be conducted at two locations: Sheep Bridge and Metolius Pond. We are expecting twelve 5th grade classes to

participate. At each site, the students engage in aquatic insect collection, water quality and fish life cycle. They also have the opportunity to see Kokanee spawning and observe redds. Each site needs 7 to 10 helpers to assist the students in this great experience (no experience necessary). The Fall Stream Side program provides COF members the opportunity to ensure that the next generation understands the importance of our natural resources.



MT'S HYBRID GRIFFITH CALLEBAETIS EMERGER

MATERIALS

Hook: Firehole 318, size 16

Thread: Uni thread, Rusty Dun, 8/0

Tail: Coq de Leon

Body: Tapered thread

Hackle: Brown Dun, size 16

Wing: White Trigger Point

TYING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Start the thread behind the eye and wrap to the start of the hook bend
- 2. Tie in a tail of coq de leon approximately twice the length of the hook shank

- 3. Wrap the thread forward to midpoint on the hook shank and extend the thread back under the tail to cock it up and then wrap forward to the midpoint
- 4. Tie in the wing and wrap forward to a point an eye width behind the hook eye. Raise the butts of the trigger point and cut at an angle. this will help taper the body
- 5. After bringing the thread back to the tail, tie in point, tie in the hackle dull side towards eye, then wrap a tapered thread body to behind wing.
- 6. Palmer the hackle forward and tie it off behind the wing
- 7. Raise the wing and use thread wraps to stand it up. whip finish
